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Blood Gradual Hemorrhage Causes Pain and Pressure Often Uterine Bleeding Precedes Events and There is Irritation in Abdominal Lining Rapid Hemmorrhage Results In Hypotension or Shock Spotting and Cramping Pain Usually Begins After First Missed Menstrual Period Symptoms Similar to Threatened Abortion Tender Mass May Be Felt At Fornix Uterus is Enlarged
