Dear Prof. Dawkins,

I read with interest the article in the "West Australia" of the 23rd November, photocopy attached.

I have arranged to forward you, on loan, a copy of the book, "The Causation of Rheumatoid Disease and Many Human Cancers. A New Concept in Medicine" by Roger Wyburn-Mason of Richmond, Surrey, U.K., which I am sure you will find most interesting.

Dr. Evan Owen already has two of these books on loan, and Dr. Tom Waters at your hospital, who no doubt you know, has read the book loaned by me for his interest in Prof. Wyburn-Mason's treatment of coeliac disease which the Professor claims is related to rheumatoid arthritis.

My daughter Vicki (20-year-old) was diagnosed through biopsy as having serious coeliac disease. After three months treatment taking Fasigyn 500, i.e. 2 grms. (4 tablets) every two weeks, a biopsy test recently carried out showed no traces of the disease, and Prof. W-M says she can return to normal food. Her case is being watched with interest by Dr. Tom Waters, and a further biopsy is planned a little later after she has been on a normal diet for a period.

My association with Prof. W-M is a long story.

My younger daughter Jenny was diagnosed as having rheumatoid arthritis at the age of two or three, and the normal treatments over 14 years during her growth period have simply stunted her growth and left her a cripple. However, thanks to Prof. W-M, the rheumatoid arthritic disease has gone and she has no pain.

I have been a promoter of Prof. W-M's works and have stirred interest in other parts of Australia and New Zealand, and am in contact with doctors in America, namely Dr. J.M. Blount Jr., of Philadelphia, Missouri, USA, a cured man who is mentioned on Page 205 of the book, and Dr. R. Bingham who first suggested I take my daughter to England to see Prof. W-M.

For your interest, I attach photocopies of articles received and also a recent letter from Dr. Bingham, which I am sure you will find interesting.

Prof. W-M's medication has varied in three years from the usual Clotrimazole, to Flagyl, to Fasigyn 500, a product of Pfizer Laboratories.

Dr. Evan Owen, I understand, has a number of patients on experiment, including his own niece. I know Dr. Owen very well, and he is aware of my promotional activities to have Prof. W-M's works thoroughly tested as soon as possible for the purpose of expediting new proven satisfactory treatment for the sufferers of rheumatoid arthritis.

I would be grateful to hear from you when I return from overseas on or about the 18th December. I hope in the meantime you have a chance to quickly study the book.
