With the following reasons: (1) Patent Bureau discovered that on Asahi daily newspaper reported before our application date and said "quoted as (AP-London) descri<sup>d</sup> in details about your New Views on Protozoa is possible aetiological causing Rheumat<sup>o</sup> diseases. (2) November 30th also (AP-London) in that same article, opinion by Jun<sup>o</sup> Medical School Hospital remarked and a severe dispraised such theory and treatme<sup>t</sup>.

Above two factors are obstacle for the Bureau deciding our Patent app<sup>r</sup>ation will be invalid and the first place that AP-London reported to Asahi News<sup>r</sup> before our application (to the Bureau that our's secondary news. Bureau's regul<sup>o</sup>ion is that Any patent application is originally very first announcement to the Bur<sup>r</sup>).

Although, Professor Wyburn-Mason himself prove otherwise, that AP-London reporter did it without your acknowledgement, selfishly reported while you ar<sup>e</sup> still experiment-  
ing, animal toxicological and clinical trials incomplete. That you never met AP-  
London nor Jpanese reporter, although you received a few telephone call for an inter-  
view but you never did see anyone of them because your resear<sup>o</sup>es were not completed  
at time.
